A New Chapter at CVUUS

Hello to all of you – CVUUS members and friends of all generations!

I'm the Rev. Tricia Hart, one of your two new part-time "contract" ministers. I will be working half-



time this year, while the Rev. Christina Sillari will be quarter-time. We'll be with you throughout this church year (and possibly longer, though nothing's been decided yet).

The last few weeks have been filled with many meetings: with CVUUS staff, the Board, Interim Search Team, and lay leaders in several different program areas. As we move into the fall, Rev. Christina and I will mostly be working on different schedules – to make the best use of our limited hours, and to apply our particular skills. Our overall goal is to help all of you meet the challenges and opportunities of this transitional time.

Working with two part-time, unrelated ministers is certainly an untraditional model for a UU congregation navigating a transition from the end of one settled ministry to the beginning of another. It's new for Rev. Christina and me, too! So far, it's been delightful to work with another colleague, and figure out how our skills and interests complement each other. Christina and I have each served UU congregations for many years; after retiring from fulltime parish ministry, working part-time with a congregation at an "in-between" time is a good way to share what we've learned.

My path to parish ministry began from my home church in Yarmouth, Maine, almost 30 years ago. Transitional ministry quickly became my chosen specialty – I enjoy the excitement and challenge of meeting a congregation with "new" eyes and ears. In the last 27 years, I've served nine congregations in four New England states, Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Ohio; I also worked as Stewardship Consultant to a few dozen other UU churches around the country. There's much that's similar among UU congregations... and it's also true that each church has its own particular story, which changes through the years. It is a privilege to serve as Minister in any congregation, and to learn and tell that story.

My spouse and partner in ministry is the Rev. Peter Newport – Peter and I worked as Co -Ministers for nine years, after which he retired and I returned to solo ministry. You will get to meet Peter at events and occasional Sundays, though he is continuing his membership at the First UU Society in Burlington. You'll probably get to meet our little dog, Waldo, too – he's become a fan of Zoom meetings!

Rev. Christina and I are still learning about CVUUS. Each of you holds part of this congregation's evolving story, so we'll need your help. Tell us what you love about this church, what you hope for, and how you imagine this next fascinating chapter at CVUUS could unfold. I will be away for a couple of weeks in September, and back on a regular schedule in time for my first Sunday on October 1. I'm looking forward to getting to know you soon.

September "Share the Plate" Donee

<u>Resource VT</u> aims to reduce poverty by creating a marketplace for reuse while providing new opportunities to the under-skilled and long-term unemployed through training programs, especially in much needed weatherization, large appli-

ance and computer repair work. **Resource VT** operates stores in Burlington (339 Pine St), Williston, Barre and Hyde Park where you can drop off and seek household goods and building supplies at affordable prices. Not only do their stores keep usable goods out of the landfill, but they also provide economic and training opportunities to Vermonters, especially to adults and youth who have barriers to employment to hone job skills and prepare for a successful work life as productive members of their communities. Their large appliance sales and service technicians can provide full-service repairs to current machines in their warehouses or in your home. They also place and sell a variety of appliances and computers at various retail locations, including at HOPE. Our office manager Laura Asermily donates supplies to them regularly and participated in their weatherization training in 2008 and recommends them highly and hopes you'll support them. 

Donating Funds from Your IRA Do you have a traditional IRA (Individual Retirement Account)? If so, then you've I made a deal with the Internal Revenue Service: Your IRA grows, tax free, until you reach a certain age (70½ if your 70th birthday was before July 1, 2019, and 72 if your 70th birthday was later). Starting with the year in which you reach that age, you're required to withdraw a minimum amount every year—the *required minimum distribution*, or RMD. There's a provision in the tax code that allows you to donate funds directly from your IRA to a qualified charity, like CVUUS. For more, ask Rich Wolfson.


