- We will work to make this a place where everyone feels welcome and things are fair for all and we will fight racism and other oppressions" – our RE simplified version of the <u>8<sup>th</sup> UU Principle</u> aka the new CVUUS Social Action covenant.

#### These two beliefs guide our Religious Exploration program for children and youth.

We want everyone in RE (including the adults) to know that they matter and that we need to work to make things better – in ourselves, our CVUUS community, and the world.



Our younger RE group this year is **The Sparks**. Our spark is the light inside us that makes us US. It's what comes alive when we are doing something we love. We can share it. It can ignite big things. The Sparks will be helping RE and the Fenn House spaces live the 8<sup>th</sup> Principle.

Our older group will be doing *Crossing Paths,* part 2 (formerly called *Neighboring Faiths*) this Fall. One of

our UU values is PLURALITY: the many different ways that people think, desire, believe, live and ARE. *Crossing Paths* investigates religious plurality by looking at different religions through activities, discussions and FIELD TRIPS.

Which ties back into what The Sparks will be doing. Embracing plurality means intentionally making space for differences. This is what **Beloved Community** is – it is a place where ALL people have what they need and are welcome.

We need people to <u>LEAD</u> some RE sessions. We have enough assistants now. #### October "Share the Plate" Donee: ACORN Network Food Hub

CVUUS seeks to support ACORN (the Addison County Relocalization Network) in its efforts to



expand its Food Hub which is centrally located on Middlebury's Exchange Street. The ACORN Food Hub hosts an Online Market and local supply chain support to aggregate, market, and distribute food products from producers and farms around Vermont's Champlain Valley. It makes it easier for wholesale buyers (restaurants, schools, hospitals, retail outlets) and community members to source Champlain Valley products from small and medium sized farms. The Food Hub increases access to markets for local producers, increasing farm viability and contributing to a vibrant local economy. We are also undergoing a feasibility study to potentially add a community kitchen that could be accessed by Viva el Sabor chefs and other community members. #### FIRE DRILL during worship this month (hint, hint)

In case of the need to evacuate, please remain calm and exit the facilities quickly. In order to facilitate the fire department's access, we gather across Charles St in Martha Soderberg's yard. If snow or other inclement weather make it impossible for us to gather there, we gather in Martha's home, 107 Water St. We ask that everyone gather there, rather than leaving for home, until all are present and accounted for, and until you're notified that it's safe to return to the Sanctuary and Fenn House. Parents especially are asked NOT to depart with their children without notifying the RE leaders. To make evacuation as quick and safe as possible, no one is to return to their seats to collect objects left behind or to try to find relatives or friends.

**Parents with children in the Nursery** are asked to exit the sanctuary building through the Nursery if it is safe to do so, in order to assist the nursery staff in safely evacuating all children. **RE leaders of groups meeting in the Fenn House:** Gather children hand-in-hand and exit the building through the nearest safe exit. Please take the daily attendance sheet, so we can assure all children are accounted for and all family members find one another. When parents and children have been reunited, the RE leader (s) may leave the children in their parents' care, noting the child's departure with their parent on their attendance sheet.

**Those with Mobility Issues:** An usher or other appropriate person(s) will assist those with mobility issues to be escorted to the furthest corner of the patio area in front of the Sanctuary (by the large CVUUS sign). From that spot, they can be easily identified by emergency personnel and assisted in further exiting. Those who may slow down the evacuation should wait until others are out. **The Safety Volunteer will be last to leave the Sanctuary** and make a final sweep of all rooms, ensuring no one is left in the sanctuary or other areas of the building, and closing all doors.



#### WHAT CVUUS SAYS ABOUT COVID

We encourage you to care for yourself and each other in whatever ways you can.

1. **If you have COVID symptoms**, please don't attend CVUUS events (unless you know you have allergies or something like that). Help us protect the <u>many</u> people who are high-risk for COVID who regularly come to worship and groups.

2. If you have been exposed to someone with COVID, it's fine to come to CVUUS but please follow the current CDC guidelines: mask inside around others for 10 days after exposure AND test on Day 5 (or earlier if you develop symptoms).

3. If you need COVID tests but aren't able to get them for any reason, please let us know and we will get you a test.

#### EVERY HOUSEHOLD CAN GET 4 FREE TESTS IN MAIL AGAIN!

Go <u>HERE</u> to order them. DONATE TESTS YOU DON'T NEED TO CVUUS We have them for folks who can't find any in stores (often a problem) or are too sick to go get them. DON'T THROW OUT "EXPIRED" TESTS! Tests may show "expired" dates on the box, but FDA has extended those dates; <u>look up YOUR</u> tests to see the updated expiration dates.
